

619 Fulton opened in the fall, a culmination of years' worth of hard work by our amazing team.

We opened a new 24,000 sq ft facility to better serve the Hempstead Community with expanded services such as Dental and Optometry in addition to our existing services including with Primary Care, Behavioral Health, Nutrition, Pediatrics, Ob/GYN and Care Management.

Maria P. a patient at Harmony Healthcare Long Island was in the hospital being treated for a lung infection and blood infection and was at high risk because she is diagnosed with high cholesterol, hypertension and has lots of appointments.

When discharged, it was challenging for Maria to schedule appointments and come to the appointments as scheduled. Maria was excited to enroll with Care Coordination because the Care manager will be able to assist her with scheduling appointments and transportation to attend the appointments.

Maria was able to get to her appointments and follow up care and manage her medications with the help of Care Coordination. Thomas R. visited the Emergency Room because his Blood Pressure was 200/95. At the hospital, the doctor and nurses provided the medications needed to control the Blood Pressure while he was under their care.

But when Thomas was discharged, he was not able to afford his medication because there was a \$50.00 copay. In speaking with his provider, she prescribed a generic medication that had \$0 copay, which was a relief to Thomas.

Thomas was able to receive his medication and his blood pressure is now under control.

We launched some exciting fundraising initiatives in 2023.

Newborn Welcome Fund – Baby Bundles By contributing to our Newborn Welcome Fund, you can help our newborns have the essentials needed for a stable beginning and thrive as they grow. Providing them with a Baby Bundle with needed essentials will give them a head start towards a healthy life. Last year, we welcomed 350 newborns. More than half of those newborns were born into households below the poverty level.

Did you know the death rate for Black infants is more than four times the death rate for White infants? Nassau County's Black babies are more likely to die before their first birthday because most are from the poorest of communities. These are the communities that we serve.

One memorable encounter involved a patient who wasn't compliant with a colonoscopy, a crucial screening for colorectal cancer. When I learned that the patient shared a room with others and lacked access to a bathroom for the necessary prep, I informed the provider and explored alternative testing options.

Beyond screenings, I've assisted patients with costly medications and tests. Early in my tenure, Dr. Horn, my assigned provider, faced a dilemma. A patient needed an MRI but lacked insurance, and the expense was prohibitive. Determined to find a solution, I reached out and discovered Zwanger's Give Back Sunday program, securing a free MRI for the patient. This collaborative effort exemplifies our commitment to healthier communities.

Being part of a safety net that ensures quality healthcare for all fuels my passion and provides a profound sense of purpose. 



Patients by Race - CY 2023


Patients by Gender - CY 2023
